Dear Friends,

I am writing this letter to you from sunny California. Now, when Martin and I moved up to Massachusetts, I quickly learned that New England has a faster pace of life than Florida. This didn't surprise me, because I know that Florida takes things slowly and I figured that everywhere moves at a faster pace than Florida. But since moving up to New England, I have been to the mid-west and the southwest and now that I'm in the far west, I am learning that you all, up in New England, you take life at a much faster clip than the rest of the country. It's not just Florida that's slow. You're faster than everyone. One refrain that I have heard more than once since I moved to New England is that the folks who are retired are working harder than when they were employed. And for those of you who are still working age, I know you work really hard too. The schedules we keep can be ridiculous and we don't have to work to earn our right at times. And even in the summer, when you think things might slow down, people are so eager to soak up the warmth and sunshine that we hurry to the beach or NH or the Cape life and whether it's sustainable, and if it's to relax. We hurry so that we can relax!

I bring all of this to your attention not only because I want to give you a lecture about slowing down and relaxing. You know your needs, and if you are operating at a pace you can't sustain, I empower you think about how you might actually take some time to breathe and slow down during this summer season. But the main reason why I bring this to your attention is to hopefully help give you some perspective. If you've lived up here for any number of years, you might not realize that the rest of the country doesn't operate at the pace that we do. We could speculate as to why New Englanders

have such a fast pace of life, I am sure there are lots reasons. But regardless of why we operate this way, I want you to think about how it's affecting you. If you have a good balance in your life and you feel like you have space to breathe and rest, then by all means, carry on. But if you find that you're dragging, that you're tired, that your calendar is full for the foreseeable future, that you're being pulled in multiple directions, that you feel guilty when you just... sit... then let me remind you that it's not just you. Lots of people are experiencing this because this frenetic pace of life is in the air we breathe and the water we drink. You have to be intentional and explicit about stepping back any saying 'no,' or 'I'll do that another time.'

Friends, the world will not stop turning, it wont even slow down, if we slow down a bit. Let us not make idols out of that which we produce, that which we do. Let us remember that we are worthy just as we are to be happy, to be balanced, to be relaxed. In these upcoming summer months, may you take some time to reflect on the pace of your not, may you have the courage to make some readjustments. There might be a reason why much of the country doesn't operate at the pace that we do, and we might have something to learn from those who take it a bit slower. May you have the strength to resist the temptation to do.

Sam Nelson held his first church organist position at the age of 13. He was a finalist in the Rodgers North American Classical Organ Competition and won second prize at the Albert Schweitzer Organ Festival, both in 2012. He is currently the organist and choirmaster at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Lynnfield. In 2014, Sam became Tour Manager and Organ Technician for Cameron Carpenter and the International Touring Organ, handling all of Mr. Carpenter's touring outside of Europe. In his spare time, he is the keyboard player and backup vocalist for a local wedding band, Somerset.

BURLINGTON HISTORICAL SITES OPEN HOUSE-JUNE 11TH

On Saturday, June 11th, the Francis Wyman House will be open to the public from 11 AM to 4 PM.

These five sites will be open from 11 AM to 3 PM.

Grand View Farm - 55 Center St. - a 19th Century connected farm complex next to the Burlington Common.

Burlington Historical Museum - Corner of Cambridge St and Bedford St - helping to tell the story of Burlington

Burlington Colonial Burial Ground - Bedford St. - near the Museum - the last resting place of many of the founders of our town

United Church of Christ, Congregational - the Old Meetinghouse - 6 Lexington St. - this is the building around which Burlington was founded

The Old West School - 106 Bedford St. - built when Washington was President of the US - the last surviving one room schoolhouse in Burlington

The Museum, the Old Meetinghouse, the West School, and the Francis Wyman House are all on the United States Register of Historic Places.

There is no charge for admission. Guides will be available at all sites.

GREEN TIPS FOR JUNE

Get a free home energy audit. Masssave.com. It's free, you get discounts and rebates on lights to windows and insulation, and you learn about ways to increase comfort and value of your home.

June is the start of more weekends away. Save energy (and money) by UNPLUGGING the appliances and machines around the home that do nothing useful while you are away. Even in the off position, most electronics draw phantom energy. If the outlets are in a difficult position, use a power cord with a switch as a more convenient way to cut the power (And it protects the electronics when in use!) Many homes have 3 countertop appliances plugged in (coffee pot, toaster, mixer) which are within easy reach of unplugging before you go away.

Buy local. We are entering the season where that can easily include food! Farmers Markets restart in June. Arlington's are Wednesdays starting June 10. Burlington's are Thursdays, starting June 16th. (<u>burlingtonfarmersmarket.org</u>) Billerica's are Mondays starting June 20 (<u>billericafarmersmarket.org</u>)



Lower costs of cooling with simple actions: Close the south & west curtains/blinds in your house on hot sunny mornings to reduce solar heating inside. Open windows for cross breeze if you're not using AC. Open a window on more than one floor for airflow. Heat rises and this helps it rise and get out of the house. Wear season appropriate attire: linen suits instead of heavy cloth, short sleeves instead of long, and then the thermostat doesn't need to be set so low at home or work.

Experiment with your lawn mower height. Grass cut too short requires a lot more water to withstand the stress and heat. Grass left too long thins out and leaves space for unwanted seeds to start and pests to move in. Finding your ideal grass height will have you mow less often, use a bit less water and save green.



The town of Burlington has instituted the 2nd step water restrictions effective back on May 1st in order to keep the town water above the recommended minimum level. Essentially, only 'night' watering allowed for established plantings. (Which is when the water usage is most efficient). Decorative plants, containers etc can still be watered by hand at any time, but even this is most efficient before 10am or after 4 pm.


