#### **COMMUNITIES FOR RESTORATIVE JUSTICE (C4RJ)**

Communities for Restorative Justice (C4RJ) is a volunteer-based, non-profit organization that helps communities respond to crime in ways that heal, hold accountable, and put right. C4RJ is currently partnered with police departments in 17 area towns, including Burlington, Lexington, Arlington and Bedford, to provide restorative justice programs to these communities.

C4RJ recognizes that crime is not just a violation of law but is a violation of people and relationships. C4RJ hosts a "circle" where the victim and offender and members of the community come together to discuss the full impact of an event and collaboratively create a repair plan. During the agreement phase C4RJ facilitators work with participants as they complete reflective exercises, letters of apology, community service, restitution and more. This allows a victim to have their needs met and an offender to be held accountable without a permanent mark on his or her criminal record. This process works to build understanding, repair trust and increase feelings of public safety.

C4RJ welcomed Burlington as a member community in late 2015 and is now actively recruiting volunteers for an upcoming fall training. Please consider getting involved with C4RJ! For more information, visit <a href="https://www.c4rj.com">www.c4rj.com</a>.
