The Deacons' Special Music Fund makes it possible for us to hire guest instrumentalists for our services and to purchase a wide variety of choral music. We are very thankful to all who have contributed to help enhance the music program of our church.

<u>The Workings of our</u> Rodgers Organ

Our church organ is a combination electronic and pipe instrument. That means that some of the sound is made digitally, and some of it is made by forcing air through a pipe. The tabs used to choose sounds on the organ are actually called "stops" because in a pipe organ the stop mechanism literally stops air from going through a set of pipes. Some stops on our organ only access digital sounds, others only access pipe sounds, and some access both.

The volume of the organ should be able to be changed by using the expression pedals -- the Swell Pedal and the Great Pedal. These pedals, on a normal pipe organ, would make the sound softer by physically closing wooden shades built in front of the pipes for the Swell (upper keyboard) and Great (lower keyboard). On our organ, they seem to only have an effect on the digital part of the instrument, not on the pipes. So when I try using the Swell Pedal or the Great Pedal, the volume of the electronic part of the organ changes, but not the volume of the pipes. There are several ways of getting around this, each with its pros and cons. One way is to shut off the pipes, which I have chosen thus far not to do because the congregation wanted a combination digital and pipe organ. Another way is to scale back on the registration when I want to make the sound softer, which is what I have chosen to do. Registration means the choice of stops to use. Our organ has

a lot of stops available, and I use maybe half of them on any given Sunday. My reasoning in using the stops I have chosen so far is twofold: trying to get the range of expression called for in the pieces I play; and since the organ committee chose such a wide variety of stops for this organ, using half of them every week seems like the least I can do to use the breadth of the instrument. I usually make choices about the number and character of stops I use based on the church calendar. We had a long season -- Lent -- during which I purposely scaled back on stops I used in order to make the music more penitential in nature. Then there was a big contrast with the Easter season, in which I decided to open up the capabilities of the organ to express the triumphal and joyful nature of the season. The Time after Pentecost, sometimes called "Ordinary Time", is when I scale back to more ordinary settings and but sometimes use something grandiose, like I did for the postlude at Confirmation. If you'd like to stop by (no organ pun intended) sometime and learn more about the organ, come by after worship. Unless I have a rehearsal or meeting scheduled right away, I'll be happy to show you around!

217TH ANNUAL MEETING MACUCC HIGHLIGHTS JUNE 17-18, 2016 AMHERST, MA.

Over 300 delegates from across the conference attend the 217th annual meeting on June 17-18 on the campus of UMASS Amherst. Rev. Angela Wells, Kate Byers and Chris Stahlinski attended.

"...proclaiming the kingdom of God and teaching about the Lord Jesus Christ with all boldness and without hindrance." Acts 28:31 was the theme for the 2 day event. A number of informational forms were offered both days. The guest minister and keynote speaker was Rev. Otis Moss III from Trinity UCC in Chicago, IL.

Major votes were taken on the following:

Welcoming Immigrants-delegates voted unanimously in favor of sponsoring a General Synod resolution that will call on all settings of the UCC to enter into covenants promising to welcome immigrants . The final draft of this resolution will be submitted to the UCC General Synod June 2017.

An overhauled version of the Clergy Compensation Guidelines was passed. Up until now clergy compensation guidelines were presented and voted on at every annual meeting, but now with this vote, the guidelines will remain in place until such a time when the Clergy Leadership Ministry Council sees a need to propose substantive changes beyond annual cost of living adjustments.

Delegates took a number of votes related to Conference Finances.

-They voted to reduce the percentage of Our Church's Wider Mission basic support that is passed on to the national setting of the church from 53 percent to 50 percent and reduce the percentage of United Church Mission from 33 % to 30 %. -A vote to increase the membership dues from \$18.55 to \$19.00 was approved.

-Delegates approved a budget with income of \$2,195,900.00, expenses of \$2,245,200.00 and a transfer from operating reserves of \$49,300.00 in order to balance the budget.
