Dear UCC Burlington Family,

Mental health awareness month isn't until May, but it has come to my attention that mental illness is something many people in our community live with. I am intimately familiar with the effects that anxiety, depression and bipolar disorder can have on our lives, and the lives of our loved ones. It's my hope that our church can be a place in which we de-stigmatize mental illness, in which we are able to take off the masks that many of us wear and live in community as our authentic selves. Having a mental health condition is not a moral failing. It's something 1 in 5 people reaching out to them. It's amazing what experience throughout their lifetime. and yet it can be one of the most isolating things that we struggle with. Please know that if you, or someone you love, it going through anything, you are not alone. Reach out. Reach out to family, to friends, to a support group, to me, your pastor. And if you're on the receiving end of one of those conversations, please don't judge, don't evaluate, don't try to fix. Listen. Just listen. We need to hear each other, especially when we're grappling with mental illness.

We must remember that nobody is "normal." It's dangerous to think that some people are, because for those who have a mental health condition, they are made to feel that somehow they aren't what they are "supposed" to be. Well, know that everyone has their problems, their burdens, their imperfections and abnormalities. Nobody is perfect or

normal: we are all abnormal in different ways. What makes you different might also be the blessing that you have to offer the world.

If you have identified with this article on a personal level, then please know that you're whole, just as you are. You have so much to contribute, just as you are. And our church needs you, as you are. If you are thinking that you need to reach out, I hope this message is the catalyst you needed to be in touch with someone who can help you. If you read this article and it made you think about someone else in your life that struggles with mental illness, maybe think about an email or phone call can do, just opening up the door for conversation could allow you to be present for someone in a way you didn't know they needed you. Above all, may each of you know that you are loved. You are loved by this community, by your family, by me, your pastor, and by the source of unconditional love, the one who created us. I hope our congregation can continue to expand our extravagant welcome to all people, especially those who feel like they don't fit in, because they aren't "normal."

He lost his home, his parents and most of his family to the Nazi invasion when he was a child. Surviving the war against all odds — literally hiding in a hole for two years — he was smuggled into British Palestine on the cusp of Israel's Warof Independence in 1948. Through the discovery of an uncle in America, Leon immigrated and began a new life in the Boston area. Everyone is invited to join this important and moving service. We will remember the horrors of the Holocaust and recommit to never, ever, allowing such atrocities to happen again. All are welcome, but please use discretion when deciding whether to bring children.
