

Dear UCC Burlington Community,

I recently came across this Japanese concept called *ikigai*, and it means your reason for being. Ikigai is the intersection of what you love, what you are good at, what the world needs and what you can get paid for. Everyone has an ikigai, the hard part is finding out what that is. For the visual learners among us, here's an image that might be helpful for you:



Your reason for being should be challenging, it should be your choice, it should involve a commitment of time and energy and it should boost your wellbeing (not drain you!). Does this seem overwhelming? Are you having a tough time thinking about what your ikigai might be? Not to worry, discernment can take a long time, in fact, I think it's a life-long process. It's helpful for me to think in these terms, (what I love, what I am good at, what the world needs and what I get paid for), so I make sure I am spending my time in ways that are aligned with my ikigai, and therefore help me to bear more fruit rather than drain me. I want to use my time effectively by doing things that help the world but are also life-giving for me.

Since Lent will be upon us soon, I decided to use this concept of ikigai to think about what spiritual practice I can take up for the season. Part of my job as your pastor is to maintain personal connections with you. I also love doing it, it's rewarding for me and helps me be a better pastor to you. Unfortunately, I don't think I have been good at that lately. I confess that my focus has been elsewhere because of our political situation. As a way of spiritually reconnecting with each of you, I have decided that for Lent, I am going to pray for each of you, everyday. The church directory will be my guide and I will go through it on a daily basis. When we bring people to the forefront of our minds, it helps us remember them and easily reconnect with them when we see them. It might even cause us to reach out to them in ways we might not otherwise have done. I hope that praying for all of you, my spiritual community, the congregation that I serve, will help me grow closer to my ikigai, or my reason for being. What might you consider doing this Lent, to connect with your ikigai? I look forward to hearing what transpires for you.




285th **Annual Meeting Warrant** Sunday, February 4, 2018 Snow Date: February 11, 2018

Here is a synopsis of Irving's book: Debby Irving grew up in Winchester, Massachusetts, during the socially turbulent 1960s and '70s. Her one-step-forward-two-steps-back experience of racial understanding eventually lead her to dig deeply into her own white privilege, where she found truths she never knew existed. NEWS FROM THE TRUSTEES AT UCC

The Trustees have completed the installation of NEST thermostats in three locations within the church. They are located in Sewall Hall (Ed Building main hall), church office and sanctuary. The thermostats have been programmed to go on and go off according to the normal usage of the respective parts of the church such as church services, office hours, weekly rentals and coffee hour in the Ed Building hall.

When the area being controlled by a NEST thermostat is not being used, the default temperature setting is 55 degrees.

For situations outside of normal usage, the temperature can be manually adjusted by turning the dial on the thermostat to turn the temperature setting up or down. After activity has been completed, the temperature should return to its normal setting on its own but it would be good to manually set it back to 55 degrees to save more energy.

An important feature of the NEST thermostats give the Trustees to set the thermostat temperatures remotely. The Trustees no longer have to be at the church to set the temperatures. With the improved controls on setting temperatures, we expect to reduce our heating costs.

Special thanks to Everett Langley and John Heald for installing equipment to extend the wi-fi service area which allows the proper operation of the NEST thermostats.

NEED TO REACH THE TRUSTEES!

One of the things the Trustees come across often are what we call "drive-by" comments or issues . People will approach a Trustee with a question or issue before or after church. Unfortunately, sometimes we don't remember until weeks later or when the person making the request asks why something hadn't been done yet.
