Good news: WE GOT THE GRANT!!

For those of you who are scratching your heads and wondering what in the world I am talking about, here are the details...

As part of my call agreement, I get a three month sabbatical after every seven years of working at the church. The year 2020 will be my 8<sup>th</sup> year at the church, so it's the appropriate year for me to take a sabbatical. At the Annual Meeting in February of 2019, I announced that I was going to apply for a grant that would fund my sabbatical travels as well as coverage for an interim pastor to fill in while I am away. While working with the sabbatical grant writing committee (Debbie Claar, Nancy Todd, Marcia Rich and Roberta Low), we decided that my time away should be a time of enrichment not only for me, but for the congregation as well. Andy, Soren and I will walk the Camino de Santiago in Spain, so we decided that the theme for the sabbatical time should be that of a spiritual journey. We will focus on taking the time and space to go deep within ourselves. As one member of the committee said, *"You know, Christianity can transform the world, but it has to start within."*

While I am gone, you're going to have many opportunities to deepen your faith and reconnect with God through a variety of spiritual activities lead by our Spiritual Activities Facilitator, Debbie Claar. The grant will allow her to organize spiritual walks, purchase supplies for all of us to make prayer bead bracelets, and we will also be able to purchase a large canvas labyrinth which we will use in Sewall Hall. We plan to have a screening of the movie "Walking the Camino," to help you all understand just what Andy, Soren and I will be embarking on. We will also have an all-church dinner together in the fall of 2020 so that we can share about the experiences we had during our time apart. We don't yet know who the interim pastor will be, but this person will work closely with Debbie to carry the theme into our worship services. I will be away for the months of June, July and August. I know that for many people, this is a time to retreat away from the church, but you won't want to do that next summer. The whole season will be chock full of exciting activities lead by our own, very talented, Debbie Claar. You will want to make sure you stick around.

In the coming months, we will keep you updated as the planning for my sabbatical progresses.

Thank you again to everyone who made it possible for us to get this grant including the grant writing committee, as well as Mark Flecchia, Chris Silva, and all of YOU, who voted to support this initiative at the Annual Meeting in 2019. I'm deeply grateful.

## PC SNIP-ITS!

Parish Council met on Tuesday 9/17/19. Below are a few important things to pass along that were discussed in this meeting.

**Steeple Repairs** - There will be a special Congregation meeting on Sunday 9/29/19 immediately following church to consider taking the necessary repair funds from the endowment. This is urgent, as the contractor strongly recommends the repairs be completed before winter. (insert pic of our steeple)

**2020 Preliminary Budget Numbers** - Parish Council went over our budget forecast for 2020. To provide for the spiritual needs of the congregational and greater community and the infrastructure needs of our building, our preliminary budget number is that we need to raise \$197,500 in pledges. You might recall that last year, even with a second mile campaign we approved a deficit budget. You will be hearing more about this on October 20<sup>th</sup> at Stewardship Sunday. We do have a few ideas to try to bring in additional funds.

**Turning the Steeple into Revenue** - The church on the hill with a tall steeple is potentially prime real estate for a cell tower (which can be installed inside the structure and not visible from the street.) We are looking for someone to champion this potential project. You do not need to be a techy to take this one. This is a bit of a long shot but if it works the revenue should resolve or at least make a huge dent in our repairs and our potential budget deficit.

**No Fall Yard Sale** - While we had an amazingly successful Spring Yard Sale (thank you Joan), we were unable to solicit an organizer for the fall event. Many have asked about the fall yard sale, suggesting that they have basements and attics that need clearing out. We wanted to mention three potential revenue opportunities for new and/or valuable items:

- Silent Auction items
- Inclusion in raffle baskets for smaller new items
- eBay - Michael Lewis has generously taken on the eBay coordinator role. He can list your item on eBay to sell on behalf of the church. Please contact Michael if you have items.

**Angela's 2020 Sabbatical** - Great news!! The grant was approved. We'll let Angela tell you more about this success.

Guest speaker for Missions Sunday/World Communion is Alynne MacLean. Here is a little background on Alynne. "While the love of chemistry is not listed as a spiritual gift in the twelfth chapter of Romans, I do believe that my passion for science is from God. And as such, I feel that He desires me to use this gift for His purpose. In my life, this has meant founding a non-profit organization called Science with a Mission (SMI) where science is used to help those in the poorest parts of our world. In these areas, many people never see the inside of a hospital or clinic. As a result, people often die from preventable diseases due to not being diagnosed. SMI strives to combine scientific knowledge with Christian compassion to bring healing physically and spiritually."
