Dear Church Family,

Mark your calendars for Saturday night, Nov. 14th at 7pm. If you can't participate in the Zoom party, that's okay, all the bidding will take place through the website. As the auction nears its end, you'll need to keep an eye on your items to see if you've been outbid. You'll also receive email notifications regarding your bidding status. All payments will be received through credit cards online.

We encourage you to share the auction website far and wide and invite friends, neighbors and family members to participate. However, each item will say whether it can be shipped or not. Some items will have to be picked up at church; something to be mindful of for bidders who are not local.

How and what to donate:

We are looking for the following: Timeshares, Vacation homes, Pet sitting, Dinnerware, Glassware, Baskets with themes, Baskets from businesses, Sports equipment, Dinners, Tea parties or other experiences, Wine, Jewelry, Crafts, Woodworking, Artwork, Autographs, Collectibles, Rounds of Golf, Gift cards for florists, salons, fitness centers, restaurants, auto repair, grocery stores, etc. The possibilities are nearly endless! Our only request is that unless something is antique or collectible, that it be brand new.

You can contact her with questions at digby@rcn.com. ***All items need to be dropped off at church by Monday, Nov. 2nd.*** That is a hard deadline, as we need time to get all the items uploaded onto the auction website. When you drop off your item, you'll be asked to fill out a form with a description of it, along with its value and the minimum price at which you think it should be sold.

The people coordinating the auction are: Kari Lynch, Joan Zink, Deb Raymond and Rev. Angela Wells-Bean. You can speak with any of us if you have questions.

Our goal is to raise \$5,000.00 and WE CAN DO IT, but we all have to do our part! Thank you for helping us make this auction a success and we hope you can join us for the auction party on Nov. 14th at 7pm!

The selection of an interim pastor for Angela’s parental leave (March 1-May 31) was discussed. The person chosen to cover the 2020 sabbatical leave is not available so we need to seek other candidates. An interview committee was chosen and all Deacons will have a chance to hear and weigh in on recordings of applicants’ sermons. Two people have applied as of mid-October and the Deacons would like to reach agreement with the final choice in December.

The 2021 budget was discussed and voted. Some items, such as music, special musicians, fellowship, and worship supplies, are hard to predict as the date we can safely return to the sanctuary is unknown.

Memorial funds were received in honor of Gim Fong and Roger and Ruby Plaisted.

The November meeting was rescheduled to the 10th to avoid conflict with watching election results.


FROM THE MODERATOR

MISSIONS SNIPPETS

Even with a pandemic, the mission outreach work of our church is ongoing. Volunteers will be helping at the Wish Tree in the mall for two days in December. As soon as we know those dates, we will publicize them. If there is anyone who hasn't volunteered yet to help out at the Wish Tree and is interested, please contact Aline Beck. The underwear and pajama collection is being organized and the information about this drive be included in a Weekly Blast and a Sunday Bulletin.

Jane McIninch, one of the coordinators of the People Helping People Food Pantry, shared with us on Missions Sunday how the pantry has adapted to meet the challenges of the pandemic. These include distribution of food to increased numbers of people, changes to the way the pantry distributes food in order to keep both workers and clients safe and an increase in the amount of food that is gathered, stored and distributed by the Pantry. Even the way the In Gathering is organized has to change. It will be held at St. Mark's church this year; clients will drive up and volunteers will place the Thanksgiving meal directly into their cars.

In October, Missions made a contribution to the Southern New England Conference of the UCC. Before the end of the year, Neighbors in Need, Blanket Sunday and One Great Hour of Sharing will also receive donations.

We are not able to take any more donations for Sister Joyce (Project Care and Concern in Boston). The shop is not open as yet during this COVID-19 crisis.
