Dear Congregants,

Our church goal this year is to focus on healing and recovery. More specifically, to heal physical, emotional, and social wounds that have injured us. As a church and community of Christ, we have been collectively trying to heal and recover for the past several months, and unfortunately, it has been a rollercoaster.

How exciting it was to have vaccines finally available, only to find it hard to secure a vaccination location and date. It took a bit of time, but finally there were enough vaccines and appointments for everyone. Then the mask mandate was lifted because COVID-19 infection rates were down. Along came the Delta variant and indoor masks are back, and unfortunately infection rates are up. Angela, our beloved pastor of 9 years gave birth to a beautiful baby boy, Emerson, and shortly later announced that she and her family would return to Florida to be closer to immediate family.

As a congregation, we have experienced joys over the past 6 months, but also disappointment. It feels hard to heal and recover with uncertainty looming in our communities and in our church. However, we want to assure you that UCC Burlington is here for you. It was no small feat to reopen the sanctuary in July, and even though online Zoom services and in-person coffee hour may not be 100 percent, we are still able to join and connect as a congregation. We have dedicated volunteers working hard to ensure that the church is meeting your needs. Whether it is the people arriving early each Sunday to prepare for service (greeters, ushers, lay leaders, music leaders, musicians, and nursery attendants), or the women that have been preparing and serving coffee, or the volunteers that set up and break down tables and chairs, we have a committed group of people making sure each Sunday morning is a time of spiritual and emotional connection for all who wish to participate, near or far.

We are also very blessed to have an energetic Interim Search Committee that is steadfastly reviewing clergy profiles, scheduling interviews, and deliberating over the search and call process for an Interim Pastor. They are working hard to ensure that we find the right person and the right fit for our congregation. Because it does not seem likely that we will have an Interim Pastor until later in the year, the Deacons have been planning and arranging for worship coverage in September. For example, we will have an Rev. Dr. Megan Snell join us on September 5th to lead us through worship and Communion. On September 12th, Welcome Back Sunday, we will welcome Rev. Dr. Fran Bogle and the Just Peace Players. They will perform a play and we will learn more about protecting the earth.

While the Interim Search Committee search and calls an Interim Pastor, Deacons are actively working to secure a 10-hour/week Bridge Pastor until the interim is chosen and can begin work. A Bridge Pastor is an ordained minister that will lead our worship services and supply pastoral visits to those who are hospitalized and sick. Our goal is to find a temporary Bridge Pastor by the middle of September. In the meantime, we have lay ministers ready to step in and lead our worship services. We do not anticipate missing a beat.

The love, grace, and dedication of our congregational volunteers, paid staff, and church boards are here for you. Everyone is putting their best foot forward to continue our church's ministries, provide support, comfort, and love, and are guiding us through this period of uncertainty. Our church goal of healing and recovery is in the forefront of our minds and actions. As a congregation, we are all doing our best to support one another in our mutual healing, so that each of us can be stronger, faithful followers of Christ.

September 12 is Welcome Back Sunday!


