Greetings, Members and Friends of UCC Burlington!

I'm Ed Koonz, your incoming Interim Pastor.

I hope my writing finds you having had a nice Thanksgiving and looking forward to a joyous Christmas – even amidst any concerns or worries you may be experiencing due to the ongoing global pandemic - or to something else deeply personal and very challenging. And, "wherever you are on your life's journey," I wish you a "Happy New Year!" as we find ourselves coming together at the beginning of this first season of the church year, the season of Advent.

Speaking of seasons, I'm a native New Englander and have lived here much of my adult life. So when it comes to seasons, I'm accustomed to change. I don't like every season equally, but I've learned to appreciate each season's unique qualities. And, while my body sometimes objects to extreme, quick temperature changes, I have learned to adapt to this change. How about you: how are you with seasonal change with respect to weather - or otherwise?

I ask because an interim time between settled pastors presents a change, one that sometimes requires a gracious acquiescence to particular changes as well as a robust adaptation to change in general. A new pastor is "different" and does things differently. For some, this may be difficult; how about for you?

It's important during a time of transition that we address our feelings - and thoughts - about the change we're undergoing because it may help our coping, adapting and moving forward.

And, what's true for individuals is true for organizations including the church. A change of pastoral leadership affects a church's system, the whole "body of Christ" in a church. It is, therefore, a time to both celebrate - and discern how to build upon - what has been accomplished as well as grieve the loss of a pastoral leader who has contributed so much to these accomplishments.

A change of leadership may be hard both personally and communally. So it is, during this interim time, you'll hear me asking lots of questions, some of which may prompt conversation about your feelings and thoughts and why you do things the way you do. And this, may lead to reflection and consideration of making changes. A change of pastoral leadership is both a challenge and an opportunity!

All the while, I hope you'll find me listening and speaking respectfully and carefully because I trust that that God in Christ is in your midst just as God was with a band of refugees - Hebrew slaves - who fled from Egypt long ago to make their way into an uncertain future in a "Promised Land of milk and honey."

The future is unknown, and it will be good to remember during this time of transition that if we find ourselves worrying about what's happening, so did those ancient Hebrews. And, then, it will be helpful to recall that when they faced a change of leaders, that Moses reminded them, as he passed on the mantle of leadership to Joshua in the wilderness: *"It is the LORD who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not fail you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed."* (Deuteronomy 31:8)

Moses' counsel offers us a reminder that amidst a time of any change, God is present like a faithful friend, reminiscent of the old singer songwriter, Carole King's lyrics in "You've Got a Friend": *"Winter, Spring, Summer or Fall, All you have to do is call; And, I'll be there, Yes, I will...*"

For a Winter, Spring, Summer, and Fall – and a little longer; for an Advent, Christmastide, Epiphany, Lent, and a Pentecost – and a little longer, I will be here for you as your pastor (all you have to do is call!). And, however you experience me as your pastoral, preaching and teaching friend in Christ, I trust you will always remember you have a friend in Jesus and the Holy presence of his trustworthy God of inclusive grace! - And that, one day, not so far away, you will enter the "Promised Land" of your future, the next chapter of your life as Christ's church here - with a new settled pastoral leader!

So, what better time could there be than this to begin our journey together than in this season of Advent - this time when we prepare - once again - to celebrate the coming of *God Emmanuel*, "GOD WITH US!"?
