

WELCOMING OUR INTERIM PASTOR

This morning we welcome our Interim Pastor, Rev. Ed Koonz. Pastor Ed resides in Nashua, was born and raised in Shelburne Falls, MA. He graduated magna cum laude with a B.A. degree in Religious Studies from Brown University in 1977. He earned a Master of Divinity degree from Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley, CA and was ordained at the Church of the Beatitudes in Phoenix, AZ by the Southwest Conference of the United Church of Christ in 1985. Rev. Koonz served as Associate Pastor of Neighborhood Church of Palos Verdes Estates, CA from 1985-1989. From 1989-2010, Rev. Koonz was Pastor of Pilgrim Congregational Church, UCC in Nashua. While there, he co-founded the Nashua Caregivers, served on the Board of Nashua Home Health & Hospice, the Southern NH Medical Center Chaplain's Advisory Team, and chaired the Boards of Emmaus Counseling Institute and the New Hampshire Teen Institute.

After 21 years, Rev. Koonz went to serve as Pastor of Hampstead Congregational Church, UCC for 6 years. In 2016, Rev. Koonz completed the Interim Ministry Network training for transitional ministries. He served for 2 years as Interim Senior Pastor at the Congregational Church of Laconia, UCC and for 3 years as Interim Pastor of the Congregational Church of Harvard, UCC.

Ed is married to Barbara, whom he met as a college student. Barbara is a retired educator with a degree in elementary and special education. Barbara and Ed have three adult children: Justin, Alison, and Elizabeth - and two granddaughters, Luma, 6 and Niall, 3.
