Dear UCC Family,

At our Annual Meeting, we voted to partner in ministry with the wider community, so that begs the question, who *is* the wider community? For the purposes of this article, I'd like to focus on the town of Burlington. Our church has been a part of this town for over 285 years. At its inception, you couldn't separate the church from the town because the church was the center of religious and civic life. Times have changed and this is no longer the case. Now there are dozens of houses of worship in Burlington, and our town governance has been separated from the church for over 100 years. Now that our church is disentangled from the operations of our community, and a marginal percentage of people in our town actually attend our church, I think we should ask ourselves the question, how well do we know our community? Do we know who Burlington is anymore? Who lives here? What are their ages and ethnicities? What do the family structures look like? What are the town's needs? What do people worry about in their individual lives and within the town at large? I suspect that we don't have accurate and precise answers to these questions, because the town is changing around us. We need to stay plugged into what makes up Burlington, in 2018.

You may have seen a few announcements about the Community Engagement Group that is forming. This group is going to try to find answers to some of these questions. Through studying demographic data (using a program called Mission Insite), doing prayer walks and interviewing key town leaders, we'll learn more about what makes up our community, and what its needs are. After we've done data collection and analysis, we'll hopefully be able to identify some of the town's greater needs. Eventually, we'll have a wider church conversation about which needs we feel called to respond to. This might sound like a lot, but I promise that being part of the Community Engagement Group will have a low time commitment. We need 10 more people to work on this. ### **Youth Service Group**

The Youth Service Group is raising funds to hold community dinners. These dinners will be for church members & people in Burlington who would like to join with others to enjoy a dinner together.

### **Money Madness, a fun competitive fundraiser.**

They're having a money madness contest to raise the funds! The premise is simple: help your team get the most points. 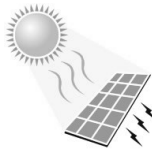

At this year's annual meeting, the Finance and Stewardship committee gave the blessed news that our second mile campaign bridged the deficit and we were able to submit a balanced budget for 2018 -- without needing the very extraordinary matching donor pledge. The donor is still interested in doing something and wants to better understand the needs and priorities of the church.

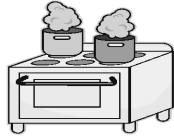
Finance and Stewardship will be collecting proposals through the various church committees and teams. These proposals will then be presented to Parish Council by the championing committees. Parish Council will select a few proposals representing the priorities of the church and its mission. These selected bids will then be presented by Finance and Stewardship to the donor for consideration.

Our congregation is made up of very creative and inventive individuals with fantastic ideas. If you have a suggestion we ask that you pass it along to the relevant committee to be considered and proposed. For example, if your idea is to improve the lighting over the Bedford Street crosswalk, that idea should be submitted to someone on the Trustees Committee. Or perhaps your initiative is to purchase i-pads for Sunday School classes. That suggestion would go to Christian Education. Don't be surprised if the committee asks for your assistance in researching your proposal.

Parish Council and Finance and Stewardship will be finalizing a submission process and timeline soon. Thank you again to our generous donor, and thank you everyone for treating this generous opportunity with respect, gratitude and a little pragmatism.

## NEWS FROM THE TRUSTEES!

### Kitchen Stove status:



Hobart had a technician come to the church to look at the kitchen stove (no charge). He found the stove was in pretty good shape and that it is actually a pretty good stove. He cleared out the soot build up in the pilot light tubes and measured the gas pressure going to the stove. He found the gas pressure was below specifications. He also replaced a broken knob (no charge).

The technician made the following recommendations:

- . Updating the gas shut off valve to the stove.
- . Have the gas company increase the gas pressure to the stove (low gas pressure could be causing soot build up).
- . Turn off the gas when the stove will not be used for long periods of time to reduce the soot build up.

A plumber came in to replace the shut off valve. National Grid came in to increase the gas pressure to the stove.

The kitchen stove/oven should be fine to be used whenever we need it. When the stove won't be used for a while, the gas should be turned off. The gas will be turned on to the stove when there is a need to use the stove.

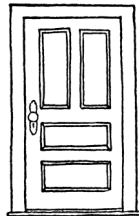
***Shirley Fong will be conducting classes on how to light the pilot lights for the Trustees and other members of the congregation.***

After years on trying to find a suitable solution to close the view into the Sanctuary closet, we decided to have a real closet door installed.

The door will be painted in the very near future.



### Church lawn care volunteers:



We are still looking for lawn care volunteers. We are looking for volunteers to help with cutting of the grass, trimming bushes and raking. Please contact the Trustees if you are interested.

### Reminders for the congregation:

It has been reported that members of the congregation while driving by the church have noticed lights were still on after people have long left the building. There have been times when entering the church, the doors were unlocked although no one was there. ***Please remember to turn off the lights if you are the last person in the area. Check to make sure the Sanctuary door and Ed Building door are locked if you are the last one or one of the last ones to leave.***



Empty liquids (coffee, tea, soda, water, etc) into the sink, NOT in the trash bags. Even though we use commercial grade trash bags (thicker, tougher than household trash bags), they can be punctured by sharp objects. The holes result in trails of liquid on the floor and carpeting (requiring people to clean up the trails of liquid). The liquids also add weight to the trash bags which makes the job harder to empty the trash bins.
