THE GREEN TEAM INVITES YOU TO TAKE THE STRAW CHALLENGE!

Thank you to all who have taken the STRAW CHALLENGE! If you visit a restaurant, etc. please remember to SKIP THE STRAW, bring your own, or just don't use one. (We do recognize that some people need straws for health reasons).

Bronze – Is the simple pledge to tell the server when placing an order that you do not want a straw. "I would like to help the environment, no straw please."

<u>Silver</u> – The silver level takes this just a little further by actively bringing your own straw and I again say, "No straw for me. I don't need a straw, I've brought my own because straws are bad for the environment."

<u>**Gold**</u> – Gold takes the prior levels a step further by trying to influence the restaurant's straw distribution practice. With this level, people would ask to speak with the manager of the establishment and ask the manager to change their practice and only distribute straws when the customer asks for one. Changing the straw distribution policy will save the restaurant money and save the environment.
