Dear friends,

Every week we gather in our sanctuary to worship God. We sing hymns. We offer prayers. We listen for the Word. We open our hearts to the movement of the Holy Spirit. But, of course, this is not the only way to worship.

Some worship by knitting, crocheting, and crafting, while others worship by gardening and caring for creation.

Speaking of those who worship by caring for creation, remember to mark your calendars for May 11th, when we will have our annual Plant and Craft Sale fundraiser. Caring for creation and building a world that supports and nourishes life is all of our responsibility as stewards of our natural world. I hope all of us will come out to support this fundraiser and help make our world not only more bright and beautiful, but more loving and generous to our local populations of birds, bugs, bees, and more. This is an act of worship and a way that we give glory and gratitude to God.

To celebrate the way our congregation cares for creation, we'll be celebrating Earth Day this Sunday, April 28th. Our congregation will receive our level 2 Green Church certificate from the UCC. This is no easy achievement! Our green team and members of our church have worked diligently for years to make our church more environmentally friendly. This Sunday we'll recognize their efforts, while highlighting some of the work they've done, and celebrating the wonder and goodness of planet earth. After church, there will be a blessing of the new bike rack that our church helped to get installed at the basketball courts at Simonds Park and we'll have a Green Fair with snacks and beverages on the lawn at the corner of Bedford and Lexington Streets. We hope you'll join us!

Finally, on June 2nd, we'll all practice worshiping outside the walls of our church together. That Sunday, instead of our usual Sunday morning worship service, we'll have several different community service projects lined up that you can sign up for. We'll send a group to WeeCare to do some painting. Another group will go to the community garden. Another will help with yard work for seniors in our church and through the Council on Aging. Another group will make meals and cards to deliver to church members. For this one day, we'll worship in diverse and different ways. We'll worship with our hands and feet, as well as our hearts and minds. I hope you'll join us as we worship in new ways, trusting that God is with us in all we do. There is no shortage of ways to show God our love and gratitude. On June 2nd, we'll show it through service and we'll let our light shine throughout our community.

NEWS FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC MINISTRIES!

Warmer Weather is coming!

We have many exciting musical events to go along with this wonderful weather!

To start off, the Music Ministries at UCC Burlington will be hosting a concert played by Brian on May 19th at 2pm in the sanctuary. This concert will be dedicated to the awareness of Mental Health and contains works from major composers in various time periods. Come join us for an afternoon of music (with refreshments to follow)!

Aline Beck and Brian Gionet will be providing a special music segment during the Mother's Day service, featuring clarinet and keys. In addition, the choir season is coming to a close soon, with the final performance being on Father's Day, June 16th. This is also Music Sunday which will feature vocal solos, choir pieces, organ solos and more. Come celebrate the joy of music and worship! The choir will resume after summer break, but the music doesn't stop! We will have soloists, small ensembles, and instrumentalists playing throughout the summer, many of whom are members of the congregation or local talent.



A significant amount of time was spent discussing Holy Week services and activities. They were considered to have gone well, especially the Palm Sunday processional from St. Mark's, which drew over 40 people, and the Good Friday activities at the ores church, planned by its pastor Trina Portillo and Andrew.

The baptism of Ella Ciccone, Andrew's first with us, went well and the congregation seemed to enjoy being involved in welcoming her into the church family.

On May 12, Crafters for a Cause (C4C) will present their blankets for Project Linus, prayer shawls, and other projects for blessing, and all the women will receive flowers to celebrate Mother's Day.

On May 19, eight new members will join the church. They have attended three classes in preparation. The first focused on what brought them to the church and what they like about it. The second meeting was on expectations: what they expect to gain from the church and what the church can expect from them. The final gathering dealt with how the church works and how people can help it work by joining a committee or the choir, helping with a fundraiser, or taking a turn at the nursery, ushering, or preparing communion.

Andrew's formal installation as our settled pastor will take place on Sunday, June 9, at 3 pm and will be followed by a reception. A large turnout is expected; sign up sheets for food and other help will be available soon.

During July and August, worship will begin at 9:30 am.

This year C4C has been working on providing blankets for use by Project Linus and Wee Care. Project Linus website says its Mission is to "Provide love, a sense of security, warmth and comfort to children who are seriously ill, traumatized, or otherwise in need through the gifts of new handmade blankets and afghans, lovingly created by volunteer "blanketeers".



Wee Care Burlington website states "Wee Care Burlington was founded with a clear goal in mind: to help children and their families to thrive. We are happy to offer support wherever we can such as clothing, shoes, toys, books and more. We have helped 5,760+ families and children so far."

On May 5 some of the blankets we have made will be blessed during service and displayed during coffee hour. We would like to acknowledge the generous support from people who are not able to attend our weekly gatherings, but donate the finished projects they make at home to C4C. Many of our Baptism blankets, including the one used during the most recent baptism were made by Tonia Egan. Judy Mack has made a number of prayer shawls. The lovely crochet pieces, made by Sheila Vitali before she passed away, are included in several of the finished blankets.

CHURCH WORLD SERVICE - BLANKET AND TOOL SUNDAY ON MAY 5TH

May 5 there will be a special offering which combines Blanket Sunday and Tool Sunday. Both are offerings to support the work of Church World Service. "Church World Service (CWS) was founded in 1946 and is a cooperative ministry of 37 Christian denominations and communions, providing sustainable self-help, development, disaster relief, and refugee assistance around the world. The CWS Blankets and Tool program aims to garner support from congregations to provide basic emergency supplies, as well as tools and resources for long-term recovery and development to communities in need internationally and nationally."




Sunday, May 5, Sunday school hosts coffee hour.
