

A Christmas Story "NEW STAR "

NEW: Look! Mary and Joseph have arrived in Bethlehem. I hope they have somewhere nice to stay. Mary looks tired.

OLD: You're right. But there was no room for them in the inn. So, Mary and Joseph stayed in a stable.

NEW: A stable ?? Do you mean like for cows, horses, and goats?

OLD: Yep. Mary and Joseph stayed in a humble stable. There Mary had her baby, and she wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in the manger.

NEW: Why did they put the baby in a manger?

OLD: It was probably the safest place they had for Him. I'm sure Joseph lined it with fresh, new hay and stood watch over Mary and the baby during the night. And now for the first time up in the sky there was a New STAR; announcing the birth of the Messiah.
