My siblings in Christ,

During the season of Lent we pack up our alleluias and set them aside to be taken out again on Easter morning. For these 40 days, we consciously and willingly forgo the feeling of exultant joy that lifts our spirits and fills our hearts during the other 325 days of the year (God willing). It's like going on a long hike. We will not keep the comforts of a cozy bed, a roof, a car, or electronic gadgets.

We'll make our way by foot, sleeping in tents, eating canned beans over campfires. But along the way we will also encounter beauties, challenges, and interactions unexpected and unplanned for. We will deal with whatever the weather gives us and find beauty in the rain, in a chance encounter with a passing stranger, and in those humble canned beans satiating a hunger we could not have previously imagined.

The reasons for these Lenten practices are as diverse as the Church body itself, but one of the feelings that comes to light for me each year is this: we are putting ourselves in the shoes of Jesus's first disciples on their way to Jerusalem. They do not know what will happen. Some are hoping Jesus will lead his considerable crowd of followers into a violent confrontation with Rome. Some hope for healing. Some hope for forgiveness. Some are not sure what to expect but are drawn to this mysterious, miraculous Galilean. But none of them, least of all Jesus's closest disciples, really expect him to be crucified and, ultimately, resurrected, despite Jesus's numerous forewarnings.

During the season of Lent, we put away our alleluias because we're called to experience the unfathomable shock and surprise of Jesus's crucifixion and resurrection. We're called to go through our Lenten journey and Holy Week spoiler-free, without presuming to know the ending, so that we too can have all our expectations upended; so that we can take our own ideas of what salvation is and what salvation ought to be and watch them disperse like shadows before the light of resurrection.

One thing we learn every Lenten season is that salvation is not what we want it to be. Whether we desire salvation from our problems, from our worries, or from our political situation – whatever it is we're longing for, Jesus gives us something different; a complete reversal of what we expect. The Good News is that the salvation we receive, the salvation that was, and is, and will be, the salvation that we celebrate every Easter, goes above and beyond even our wildest expectations. The salvation we receive colors every aspect of our lives. It transforms grief to gratitude, poverty into plenty, death into life.

As we prepare our hearts to embrace the mysteries of Holy Week and Easter morning once again, may we let go of our own expectations and allow ourselves to be transformed by the journey itself. May we quiet our spirits and open our ears to hear God's still, small word for us. May we witness Christ crucified and be amazed by whatever unexpected miracle happens next.

It was a long meeting, with much of the time spent discussing Lent, Holy Week and Easter events and plans.

On Ash Wednesday, 'ashes to go' were popular in the morning both at the church and True North. The evening service, held here jointly with the Presbyterian church, was attended by 22, with about 75% from our church.

The first session of the monthlong Lenten workshop, 'Aging with Grace,' was attended by 12. Its leaders are Debbie Claar and Andrew.

Deb Raymond and the CE committee have organized a noontime Palm Sunday procession from St. Mark's to our church again this year. The Deacons will provide refreshments.

On Maundy Thursday, worship will be in Sewall Hall at 6:30, again with the Presbyterians, and will include a simple meal of soup and bread. Readers are needed for the service.

The Presbyterian church will offer the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, with the time to be determined.

All are welcome to join the Deacons on Saturday, April 19th at 9:30am to decorate the sanctuary for Easter.

On Easter, the Sunrise service is scheduled for 6:30 am at Simonds Park. There will be an Easter egg hunt provided by CE at 9:45 and the decoration of the large cross in the sanctuary will begin at 10:15 before the 10:30 service, which will feature guest musicians.

Music is one of the Deacons' responsibilities under the constitution, and there was extensive discussion about the process of selecting a new Director of Music Ministries. Possible search committee members were identified and will be approached. Survey responses are coming in both on paper and online. The goal is to have someone in place by the end of the summer. Debbie Claar, Aline Beck and the Special Music Committee will oversee music in the meantime.

Eight people are taking the new members class. Those who decide to join will be welcomed on May 4.

Work continued on the Memorial Fund Policy, which should be finalized shortly.
