While summer is drawing near, we still have several wonderful church events coming up in June. First, on June 1st we will welcome this year's confirmation class as members of the church. We hope you will come and support our 8th and 9th graders as they take this important step on their faith journey. Of course, there will be cake after worship to celebrate!

The following week has two major events: the Burlington Pride celebration on June 7th and Service/Service on June 8th.

Burlington Pride will take place on the town common on Saturday June 7th from 11-2pm. This is a day to celebrate and affirm the LGBTQ+ community in our town. Our church will have a table at the celebration where we'll give out rainbow prayer squares and bracelets. It's a good day to let all our neighbors know that we believe all God's children are beloved and to celebrate all our LGBTQ+ siblings who help to make our church and our community a beautiful and loving place.

The following day, Sunday June 8th, is our second Service/Service, where, instead of our usual Sunday worship service in the sanctuary, we'll worship God by heading out into the community to perform acts of service.

We will sing a song and offer a blessing then we'll go out to one of several different service opportunities, some of which include making and delivering lunches to church members, building bee hotels to support endangered native bee species, and weeding and planting our pollinator garden. We're finalizing a few more projects so stay tuned for a final sign up list that will be sent out next week.

Finally, June 15th will be our music celebration Sunday, where we will give thanks to the choir, as well as our music leaders, for sharing their gifts with us all year long.

God's Spirit of faith, love, and service is moving in our congregation. Feel it and let it move you to celebrate, to sing, and to serve one another this month.

DEACONS Leading through Serving.

The meeting was spent reviewing Holy Week services and looking ahead to late spring activities.

The Maundy Thursday service was well attended with more than 30 people there. Something similar will be done next year.

Unlike last year, the Good Friday activities at the Presbyterian church were not well attended.

The 6 am Sunrise Service atop Simonds Park was very windy and drew the usual small group.

The 10:30 Easter worship was attended by more than 100 people. A few ideas were offered to make the celebration more visible to the community next year.

A suggestion was made to post pictures of the new members, choir, and boards and committees on the bulletin boards. This will be helpful as the congregation grows and people change roles.

The 'Service/Service' and Children's Sunday are scheduled for June 8. We will meet in the sanctuary at 10:30 for a brief worship service before heading out to work on the day's projects. Participants can go home after their project is finished.

At the request of the trustees, the Deacons approved the use of \$3280 in memorial funds to replace 26 pairs of shutters on the church. Parish Council approved the expenditure at their May 20 meeting.

A Blessing of Pets will be held outside on Sunday, June 22, at 4 pm. Pets must be on leashes or in carriers or cages. People may bring pictures of their pets or stuffed animals as well.

After a bit of discussion, it was decided that worship time will remain at 10:30 in July and August.

The banner on the side of the building facing Church Lane is quite faded and needs to be replaced. Several new people mentioned that it caught their eye while looking for a church. Andrew is looking for ideas for content.

There was some discussion about adding a picnic table to the grounds for people out walking or for drivers who need a break and aren't familiar with the area. This will be continued at the next meeting.

MISSIONS TREASURER'S REPORT FOR MAY

In May \$1000 was paid to the SNEUCC. This is the second of 4 quarterly payments, which will total \$4500 by the end of 2025. In commemoration of Pride Day, a donation of \$1000 has been made to the LGBT Asylum, headquartered in Worcester. Missions has also set aside \$1000 to support our participation in Pride Day on the Commons on Saturday, June 7th.

MISSION NEWS

After much research, involved discussions and prayers Missions has decided to support the work of 10 local, national and international benevolences. Each will receive a donation of \$1,000.

Missions also supports the outreach of our church to the LGBQT+ community on Burlington Pride Day, June 7 from 11 to 2PM. We will have a table on the Burlington Common where items and written material will show the community that all are welcomed by our church.

Missions will change its monthly meeting dates to the 4th Thursday of every month so Rev Andrew can join our meetings.

EASTER OFFERING

The Easter offering received a total of \$4,901.25 which was divided 50/50 with \$2,450.62 going to the Church to continue its work. Additionally \$2,450.62 will be sent to the UCC disaster relief fund for the victims of the LA fires last winter.

BLANKET AND TOOL SUNDAY IS ON JUNE 15^{TH}

This dual offering will support the Church World Service work helping our worldwide neighbors in need. CWS will use your donations to supply blankets to the homeless, distribute blankets after disasters, donate blankets to refugee camps and in other situations where people need to know they are not alone. CWS will be able to supply tools to communities that need them to plant seeds and safely contain livestock, which will allow them to grow food thus creating a healthier future for their families. Additionally, after disasters tools can be given out to help repair the damage caused.

Specially marked envelopes will be in the pews, and outside the Church office in early June. If you wish to donate using a check, please mark the memo line with blankets/tools. You may also give digitally using Venmo. Details about this are on the Church Web site.

NEWS FROM THE GREEN TEAM!

This spring and summer the Green Team's focus is on the 4 Bs and what you can do to protect them.



-BIRDS- important for pest control, pollinators and seed dispersal but have seen a 29% decline in the past 50 years.



-BEES-important for pollinators and honey but are expected to decline by 60-70% in 2025!



-BATS-needed for pest control, especially mosquitos and reduce pesticide use. They are expected to decline by 52% in the next 15 years.



-BUTTERFLIES-important pollinators that have seen a 22% decline between 2000 and 2025.

During Service/Service Sunday on June 8th the Green Team will be hosting an all ages event where we will be making bee houses. We will also have available a list of pollinator plants, milk weed seeds for you to plant and bird and bat house plans.

Coming in the fall there will be a book discussion on "The Serviceberry" by Robin Wall Kimmerer, the New York Times bestselling author of "Braiding Sweetgrass, a bold and inspiring vision for how to orient our lives around gratitude, reciprocity, and community, based on the lessons of the natural world.
