Dear church,

At the end of December, I always run into the same problem. When I need to schedule a meeting or check a date, I try to flip the page and find – well, nothing. The end of my calendar, or the front cover of my planner staring back at me. Life goes on, appointments need to be scheduled, and yet, according to the ways we customarily keep track of time, there's a major barrier between the days of December 2025 and January 2026.

Despite the fact that the earth continues on its course around the sun. According to our calendars, there's a big difference between last Sunday and next Sunday. Sometimes we internalize this difference as well. We celebrate the new year. We make resolutions. We buy new calendars. It's a good time for us to perceive a new thing.

Through the prophet Isaiah, God says, "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth." The truth is that God is always doing new things. The question God has for us is, "Do you not perceive it?" The new year is the time when my calendar and planner conspire to force me to perceive the new things that God is doing.

But God isn't just doing new things for the sake of novelty. God's new thing is real renewal, real transformation; a way in the wilderness, rivers in the desert. God is making a way where there was no way. God is creating nourishing sustenance in a place of danger and death. God is building a world that fosters life, beauty, and community from what was desolate and deserted.

God is about to do a new thing: a way in the wilderness, rivers in the desert. Do you not perceive it? The fact that this question needs to be asked makes me think that I am not alone in needing to be reminded periodically of the new things God is doing in the world and in my life. So let's be grateful that, as our calendars expire, we must lift our heads out of our schedules and perceive the new things that God is doing.

## DEACONS

Leading through Serving

There was much to go over to finalize plans for Christmas Eve services. The group also reviewed how decorating the sanctuary for Christmas went; it was more complicated than usual as it was the same day as the Mistletoe Market, in which some deacons were involved. Several ideas were generated to make the decorating easier and more organized next year.

The arrival of the poinsettias and their preparation for the sanctuary and delivery to members and friends of the congregation who have had challenges or joys since Easter was discussed.

Several ideas for fellowship events were considered.

To follow up on previous meetings' discussions on the need for replacement chairs in Sewall Hall, Deana had researched both chairs and storage racks. The Deacons approved \$3000 from General Memorial Funds for chairs and a chair rack. Parish Council approved the request at their subsequent meeting and the order was placed for 48 folding chairs and a rack that holds 84 chairs. Total cost was \$2027.26; the chairs are scheduled to arrive on January 6th and the rack between the 7th and the 12th.

Major changes are coming to the deacons, as Bobbie, the longtime secretary, left the board recently and Dave McNeil, longtime treasurer and Marcia Rich, longtime active member, are leaving the deacons as of the annual meeting. Anyone interested in becoming a deacon should speak to Andrew.

### MISSIONS REPORT

Parish Council accepted our recommendation that 100% of the Christmas offering go to our church to help with past and present deficits. In the meanwhile Missions made two special offerings of \$2000 each from its own budget. The International Institute of New England helps immigrants with education, language, employment and housing. The United Church of Christ Disaster Ministries provides relief services in Jamaica and Cuba where areas were devastated by Hurricane Melissa.

The committee is grateful for support from members who helped gather underwear, pj's., etc for 31 families in need. Coats Boston received 12 children's coats from the congregation. We also appreciate the folks who manned the Wish Tree at for People Helping People at the Burlington Mall.

As we look forward to the year ahead the Missions Committee will be reviewing decisions made last year and discerning which ways to invest our donations in 2026.

### WISH PROJECT, CHELMSFORD

We plan to start collecting and taking clothing to the Wish Project in North Chelmsford but date for this is to be decided. It will be posted in the weekly Blast. Clothing needs to be clean without tears, holes, stains and having all its buttons. It also needs to be seasonally appropriate.

We are looking for someone to transport the donations to Wish Project. Wish Project is located near the Route 4 rotary in North Lowell. If you can help, please let Bobbie or Susan Eby know.

- Season appropriate used clothes in good condition like ...
  - Warm coats, Sweatshirts and sweatpants (especially hooded sweatshirts), Sweaters
  - T-shirts, Long-sleeve shirts, Jeans, khakis and other casual pants
  - Waterproof boots, comfortable shoes, and sneakers, Hats, waterproof gloves, scarves, Belts
- New
  - White socks
  - Underwear and bras of all sizes from Small to XL
- Other supplies like
  - Carrying cases, backpacks, tote bags, fanny packs, small suitcases with wheels, travel-size toiletries
  - Soap, shampoo, deodorant, lotion, ChapStick, toothpaste, shaving cream in small sizes, toothbrushes, disposable razors, and tampons, Sleeping bags and blankets.
